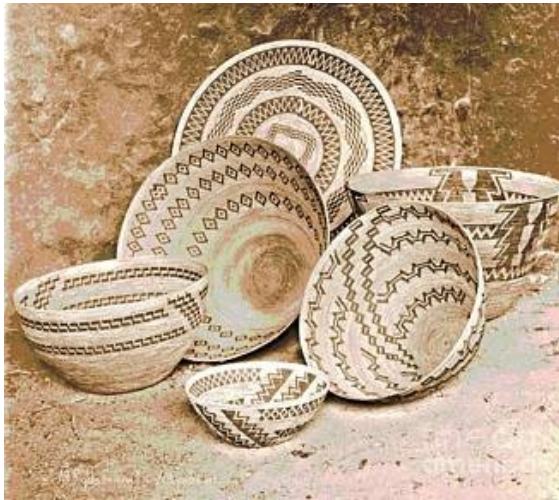


MISSION

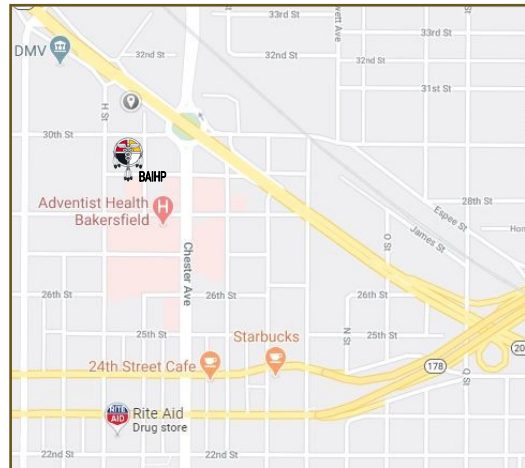
ELIGIBILITY

- Bureau Indian Affairs issued Certificate Degree of Indian Blood Card
- CA Judgement Roll
- Descendant of any of the above (limited to 2 generations)

The Bakersfield American Indian Health Project (BAIHP) is an Urban Indian health program funded by the Indian Health Service as an outreach and referral center.

HEALTH SERVICES

The Medical department provides intensive case management and diabetes management services for eligible clients. Case management services includes public health nursing assessments, health education and referrals to primary care providers and specialists with payment assistance for health care needs. Clients may also be referred for dental, vision and pharmacy needs.

An Associate Marriage and Family Therapist and a Certified Substance Abuse Counselor provide the counseling services as well as care coordination and referrals for outside providers for additional services.
